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FAMILY FIRST PREVENTION SERVICES ACT

The vision for Family First is to keep children safe, strengthen families and reduce the need for foster care whenever it is safe to do so.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR TITLE IV-E PREVENTION SERVICES FUNDS?

- A child (and their caregivers) who is identified as a candidate for foster care who can remain safely at home or in a kinship home and is at imminent risk of entering foster care
- A child in foster care who is pregnant or parenting
- A child whose adoption or guardianship arrangement is at risk of a disruption/dissolution and includes postreunification services

FOSTER CARE PROGRAM CHANGES



WE BELIEVE THAT CHILDREN DO BEST WHEN RAISED IN **FAMILIES**



After a two-week grace period, Family First limits IV-E Maintenance Payments to:

- Family and kinship foster homes
- Placements for pregnant or parenting youth
- Supervised independent living for youth 18+
- Qualified Residential Treatment Programs (QRTP) for youth with treatment needs
- High quality residential placements and support services for victims of sex trafficking
- Family-based residential treatment facility for substance abuse (beginning October 2018)
- **Current AFDC requirements remain unchanged
