I. Welcome and Introductions

Delegate Brewer welcomed the Advisory Group and the public to the meeting and introduced Dr. Patricia Popp.

II. Navigating Access to Education for Students Not Living With Their Parents: Unaccompanied Homeless Youth, Foster Care, and Guardianship

Patricia A. Popp, Ph.D., State Coordinator for the Education of Homeless Children and Youth & VDOE Educational Stability Liaison for Students in Foster Care, Project HOPE-Virginia, William & Mary School of Education

Dr. Popp began by reviewing the work of Project Hope. Her presentation discussed the pertinent legislation related to enrolling youth in school including McKinney-Vento, overlapping child welfare and education laws, and *Code of Virginia* § 22.1-3(A)(4)(iii). She highlighted the gaps in the current system that prevents some students from enrolling where they are currently living or remaining enrolled in their school of origin. Dr. Popp also reviewed recent survey data of school division McKinney-Vento liaisons.

III. Legal Custody and Guardianship in Virginia

Delegate Brewer introduced Ana Beltran and Heidi Epstein. The presenters explained the work of the ABA Center on Children and the Law and Generations United. Additionally, they explained their work in Virginia. Their presentation also consisted of a Kinship overview and an explanation of legal custody and guardianship in general as well as the laws specific to Virginia. Ms. Beltran and Ms. Epstein concluded this section by going over the missing elements of Virginia care and custody laws.
