- Manage by data to improve health and behavioral health outcomes
  - Use health, behavioral health, and psychotropic medications outcome data for decision making on a regular basis



- Manage by data to improve educational outcomes
  - Use educational performance and predictors of success outcome data for children in foster care to improve decision making on a regular basis



- Improve appropriate and effective use of psychotropic medications for children in foster care
  - Implement strategies for consent and monitoring
  - Increase availability and access to child and adolescent psychiatrists
  - Increase knowledge of prescribers, mental health clinicians, health care providers, child welfare staff, family members, caregivers, and judges



- Increase access to and appropriate use of trauma informed and evidence based behavioral health services
  - Increase percentage of children screened and assessed for trauma and mental health needs
  - Increase availability of trauma-informed behavioral health services
  - Increase training for mental health clinicians, child welfare staff, judges, etc.



## Next Steps: Technical Assistance

- Analyze data to set baselines
- Explore options to define "medical necessity" beyond diagnosis to address complex trauma
  - July 11 joint letter to State Directors of child welfare,
     Medicaid, and behavioral health from federal agencies
     (ACF, CMS, SAMHSA)
- Customize managed care for children in foster care
- Identify lessons learned from managed care states
